Kaga's deceptively simplistic, "faux-naive" paintings could be mistaken, from a distance, for being somewhat twee; closer inspection reveals a more sombre underbelly. But for all its inability to shake off a perversive and choking melancholia, Kaga's work is also woven with rich glimmers of humour and humanity, making his surprisingly perceptive work both endearing and intriguinig. It's well worth investing a little extra time in.
